

KASCD's Scholarship Award

Kansas Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development Scholarship Award Application Procedures

PURPOSE:

1. The recipient will be an aspiring curriculum leader and/or supervisor.
2. The recipient will be employed as an educator in an educational-related occupation in the state of Kansas.
3. The recipient need not hold current membership in KASCD.

SELECTION PROCEDURES:

1. A selection committee will be appointed by the President of KASACD.
2. Nominations will be obtained from KASCD membership by the selection committee.
3. The nominee will submit the following information to: Dr. Teresa San Martin, KASCD President, c/o Goddard Public Schools USD 265 at 201 S Main, Goddard, KS 67052 or through email to tsanmartin@goddardusd.com .
 - a. Autobiographical sketch
 - b. Statement concerning aspirations involving curriculum and/or supervision, leadership and relevant information which show how the scholarship will be used to achieve these goals.
 - c. Three letters of recommendation.

SUBMIT APPLICATIONS TO:

1. The nominee will submit the following information to: Dr. Teresa San Martin, KASCD President, c/o Goddard Public Schools USD 265 at 201 S Main, Goddard, KS 67052 or through email to tsanmartin@goddardusd.com .
2. The recipient will receive a check for \$500.00. The money shall be used for tuition to attend a college or university of his/her choice. In addition, the recipient will have his/her KASCD membership dues paid for the following year.
3. Only one person may be recognized in one year. The award shall be an annual event. If no person qualifies, the award shall not be given in that year.
4. Recognition in the form of a plaque will also be presented to the recipient.

SELECTION COMMITTEE:

1. All applications will be screened by the KASCD Grant Committee.
2. This committee is chaired by the President and includes the Vice-President, Vice-President Elect, and the Kansas Executive Director.

CALENDAR:

1. December 1, 2011 is the deadline for submitting materials.
2. Awardees will be notified in January 2012 and be awarded their grant monies. Awardees will receive formal recognition with a plaque in April at the Spring 2012 Curriculum Leader's Meeting held in Topeka each year. Awardees can look forward to sharing with others across the state at that time.
