

# President's Grant

## Kansas Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development President's Grant Application Procedures

### PURPOSE:

1. To stimulate interest and growth of KASCD as an action-oriented organization.
2. To stimulate research and application of effectiveness.
3. To assist KASCD members who are interested in enhancing teacher and/or school effectiveness.  
Approved topics must relate to one or more of the following areas: curriculum mapping, aligning the curriculum; and/or integrating curriculum and assessment.

### CRITERIA:

1. KASCD funds will be used for teaching or staff development activities.
2. Applicants must be members of KASCD.
3. Must show promise of success.
4. Must show impact on the students, school, or district rather than an individual applicant.
5. Must show promise of continuation after the grant award is spent.
6. Must show effective use of funds to carry out the project.
7. Must include evaluation strategies that will be used to measure the success of the project.
8. Applicants may submit only one application.

### SUBMIT APPLICATIONS TO:

2. **Up to four (4) grants of \$250 may be awarded.** The award(s) shall be an annual event. If no person qualifies, the award(s) shall not be given in that year. Recipients are expected to submit an article about their project to be published in the KASCD Ezine at the conclusion of their project or before the end of the 2011-2012 school year.

### SELECTION COMMITTEE:

1. All applications will be screened by the KASCD President's Grant Committee.
2. This committee is chaired by the President and includes the Vice-President, Vice-President Elect, and Executive Director.

### CALENDAR:

1. March 1, 2012 is the deadline for submitting materials.
2. Awardees will receive their recognition in Topeka at the April 2012 Curriculum Leader's Meeting.
